Last term saw our young instrumentalists' most ambitious performance so far. Musicians from St.

Joseph's and Ferney Lee Schools played for a packed audience at Square Chapel Arts Centre in Halifax on

20th June with solo and ensemble pieces on violin, cello, guitar, bassoon, flute, trombone and tabla, as well as some beautiful singing of compositions in English and Urdu by Nusrat Fateh Ali Khan and Henry Purcell.

The evening began with the presentation by some very special guests from Hebden Bridge Women's Institute of a cheque for £2100. Thank you, H.B. W.I., for all your fundraising work and support for our young musicians!

The summer term also saw fundraising concerts from two very different and very brilliant choirs: the much-loved Cantorelli and Todmorden's newest choir, Vocal Highs.



Since this time last year, you have donated a heart-warming total of £12,163. This has helped to provide weekly instrumental lessons for 80 children on many different instruments and to enrich the lives of young people and their families in our community.

On 17th October, some of our pupils will be performing for the Lord Lieutenant of Yorkshire, who is making a rare visit to Todmorden. M₄M has been chosen as one the community groups that best represent our uniquely creative town.



Further afield, the Choir of Salford Cathedral, which has a connection with St. Joseph's School, will be raising money for Music for the Many with their charity concert on 5th October at the Cathedral in Salford.

We are very excited to announce that next term, on 7th February, we will be hosting a performance by one of the great stars of Indian Classical music, Shahbaz Hussain, maestro of the tabla, ready to inspire our children who are studying this beautiful instrument and learning all about South Asian music.
