We've got an exciting programme of events lined up for 2022, but first let's look back at what has been happening in the world of Music for the Many over the past few months:




M4MCREATE

The summer term ended with a surprise outdoor performance, marking the end of our M4MCREATE project funded by Arts Council England. After so many attempts to stage a live performance of our children's new works were thwarted by the covid pandemic and after having to cancel our usual concert series for more than a year, it was

especially meaningful to be able to give a real-life concert, especially on such a beautiful, sunny day in beautiful Pollination Street in beautiful Todmorden. It was marvellous to see so many of you, our supporters, there. The children accompanied their singing with BSL signing, led by our visiting artist, Amy-Rose Atkinson, as they performed songs from our new album of original music inspired by life during the pandemic. For many of the young people, this was their very first M4M live performance.

The album, A Year of our Lives by Music for the Many, is available to download from itunes and other online music shops, with all proceeds helping to fund our work with Todmorden's children and young people.

For the second half of the Autumn term each year, much of our work is focussed on Christmas music, which is always a wonderful way for our young musicians to connect their music-making with their families and the community. This year we set them the challenge of composing some new

The term ended with three marvellous performances from our pupils at St. Joseph's, Ferney Lee and Todmorden High, where the new songs were

premiered. Each concert also included a different pupil-led arrangement of Last Christmas: At St. Joseph's this was a classical guitar trio with a brilliant



solo singer; at Ferney Lee it was an original trio of keyboard, violin and tabla; and at Tod High it was a big, loud rock band. Other highlights were our more advanced violinists braving some new high notes in *Silent Night*, an astounding tabla solo at Tod High and the debut of St. Joseph's School M4M brass band, playing *Jingle Bells*.



Many of our musicians were performing in public for the first time ever. Well done to all!

On **18**th **February** we welcome back our good friends **Manouche North**, a feelgood, flamboyant blend of gypsy jazz and klezmer. **1**st **April** sees a performance from the highly inventive **Red Hippo**, led by woodwind wizard Peadar Long. On **13th May** we are very excited to be welcoming a true virtuoso, international star of classical guitar, **Robin Hill**. Because we truly believe that these musical opportunities must be available to all, admission to all our concerts is pay-as-you can. However, in order to be safe during the
